JAN HENRY: A Polish Swimmer's True Story of Friendship from Auschwitz to America

The Consulate General of the Republic of Poland, Los Angeles has just posted HENRY: A Polish Swimmer's True Story of Friendship from Auschwitz to America by author Katrina Shawver (Köehler Books, October 2017) to its website under the heading "Books from Poland and on Poland – in English." 
